1. Call to order, roll call of members, establish quorum.

Kathy Grost called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m.

2. Explanation of recent legislative changes to NRS 241 – Open Meeting Law. (Henna Rasul)

Ms. Rasul was not in attendance at the meeting.

3. Public Comment.

There was no public comment at this time.

4. * Review and approval of minutes from April 18, 2011 meeting.

Wendy Ronovech made a motion to approve the minutes as submitted. Kathy Grost seconded the motion. A vote was taken and the motion carried.

5. *Update, discussion and possible action regarding Boy Scout Expo in Southern Nevada.

Ms. Ronovech stated that she attended the Expo with some other members from the Council and passed out 75-100 pieces of information.

6. *Update, discussion and possible action regarding promotion of Boy Scout patch program in Southern Nevada. (Wendy Ronovech)

As soon as the patch is available in the south, Ms. Ronovech will begin promoting the patch at round table meetings with the Boy Scout leaders. Ms. Grost stated that it is possible to do the same kind of promotion in the north. Ms. Ronovech commented that there were a lot of distractions at the Expo and she looked forward to promoting the patch in a different venue.

The committee briefly discussed the logistics of delivery of, and payment for, the southern Nevada patches.

7. *Discussion and possible action regarding statewide distribution of Boys Scout “Peace Begins at Home” patch.

Ms. Grost brought up the possibility of organizing high school students to disseminate domestic violence information. Ms. Prentice stated that the last time the project was discussed with the Attorney General, she had indicated that the Attorney General’s office probably did not have the resources to support it.

Ms. Ronovech asked if the Committee had considered developing the Boy Scout materials in Spanish. Ms. Henderson stated she thought it was a great idea but wanted to know what the Boy Scouts currently do. Ms. Grost stated that the Boy Scouts would support the project if the Committee developed bilingual materials but that they lacked the resources to do it at the Boy Scout office. If this program could be a pilot program for domestic violence awareness on a national

level, then the national office would produce the materials bilingually. Ms. Grost thought that maybe someone in the Southern Nevada Boy Scouts office would be willing to contact the national office if that were something the Committee wanted to do.

8. *Schedule future meetings and agenda items.

Ms. Webber will check with the Committee chair and Attorney General staff and send out some possible meeting dates. The next meeting was subsequently scheduled for October 13, 2011 at 10:00 a.m.
