Crime Clock - One Human Trafficking Offense Every 1 Day, 16 Minutes

Human trafficking offenses are separated by the FBI Uniform Crime Reporting program into two subcategories, Commerical Sex Acts and Involuntary Servitude. They are defined below. Human trafficking is a relatively new data collection category implemented by the FBI; therefore, year-over-year data comparisons are not available.

Commercial Sex Acts: Inducing a person by force, fraud, or coercion to participate in commercial sex acts, or in which the person induced to perform such act(s) has not yet attained 18 years of age. For a crime to be considered Human Trafficking a third party must benefit in someway from the forced commercial sex acts, such as a pimp, or the person performing the commercial sex act must be a minor.

Involuntary Servitude: The obtaining of a person(s) through recruitment, harboring, transportation, or provision, and subjecting such persons by force, fraud, or coercion into involuntary servitude, peonage, debt bondage, or slavery (not to include commercial sex acts).
