### The Position

Criminal Investigators in the Attorney General's Investigations Division perform criminal investigations involving violations of federal and/or State laws pertaining to a specific program or regulatory area which includes, but is not limited to, Medicaid fraud, workers' compensation fraud, consumer protection, public integrity, human trafficking, computer forensics, missing children, financial fraud, alleged criminal offenses committed by State officers or employees, and all types of conflict of interest cases submitted by outside agencies, along with participating in multi-jurisdictional task forces comprised of officers from federal, State and local enforcement agencies. The investigative process is initiated following a formal request for service, upon receipt of a complaint from the public, or as a coordinated effort with federal, State or local law enforcement and criminal justice agencies.

Depending on the location of the most qualified candidate this position may be located in Carson City, Reno or Las Vegas.

These positions are located in our Workers Compensation Fraud Unit (WCFU). The WCFU's primary responsibility is the investigation and prosecution of workers compensation fraud, claimant fraud and provider fraud. The successful applicant will be expected to conduct fraud investigations involving violations of federal and/or State law pertaining to a specific program or regulatory area such as Workers Compensation Fraud. Under general supervision, applicants must have the ability to conduct interviews, with cooperating individuals, witnesses and other law enforcement or State agency sources to obtain information regarding criminal investigations, case history, goals and objectives. Applicants must gather and preserve evidence, document information, utilize case management tools, develop case files and develop final reports and information and investigative reports prior to initiating criminal prosecution. Applicants must have the ability to conduct complex or difficult investigative assignments that may involve multiple criminal violations or suspects. Spanish speaking applicants are preferred.

### To Qualify

#### Education and Experience

1) Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university in criminal justice, police science, or closely related field; current, at a minimum, Category II POST certification in Nevada; and one year of criminal investigation and law enforcement experience involving standard investigative and enforcement techniques utilized to enforce local, state and/or federal and agency laws, preparation of detailed investigative reports, and implementation of agency program goals and objectives; OR graduation from high school or equivalent education; current, at a minimum, Category II POST certification in Nevada; and three years of criminal investigative and law enforcement experience involving standard investigative and enforcement techniques utilized to enforce local, state and/or federal laws, statutes and regulations, preparation of investigative reports and implementation of agency program goals and objectives; OR an equivalent combination of education and experience; OR one year of experience as an AG Criminal Investigator I in Nevada State service.

#### Special Notes

1) Applicants must meet the minimum standards for appointment as a peace officer as established in the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) and Nevada Administrative Code (NAC).  
2) AG Criminal Investigator II, AG Criminal Investigator Supervisor and AG Deputy Chief Investigator must maintain, at a minimum, Nevada POST Category II certification as a condition of continuing employment.

#### Special Requirements

1) Persons offered employment in this series must submit to a background, medical, and psychological evaluation.  
2) A valid driver's license is required at the time of appointment and as a condition of continuing employment.
