## Nevada Attorney General to Deliver Keynote Address at Alcohol Law Symposium

ALEXANDRIA, VA – <u>Nevada Attorney General Catherine Cortez Masto</u> will deliver the keynote address at the <u>Center for Alcohol Policy (CAP) Sixth Annual Alcohol Law Symposium</u> to be held October 23-25, 2013, at the <u>Grand Hyatt Washington</u> in Washington, D.C.

This annual event brings together a wide range of experts in the field of alcohol law – including attorneys, current and former alcohol regulators, academic thought leaders, public health advocates and other experts – to discuss and debate current alcohol laws and challenges.

<u>Catherine Cortez Masto</u> has served as Nevada's attorney general since 2007. As the chief law enforcement of the state, she has committed her time in office to protecting and advocating on behalf of the people and communities in Nevada. Prior to her service at the Attorney General's Office, she worked as an assistant county manager for Clark County, Nevada. She also served as a federal criminal prosecutor for the United States Attorney's Office in Washington, D.C. and was chief of staff to Governor Bob Miller.
