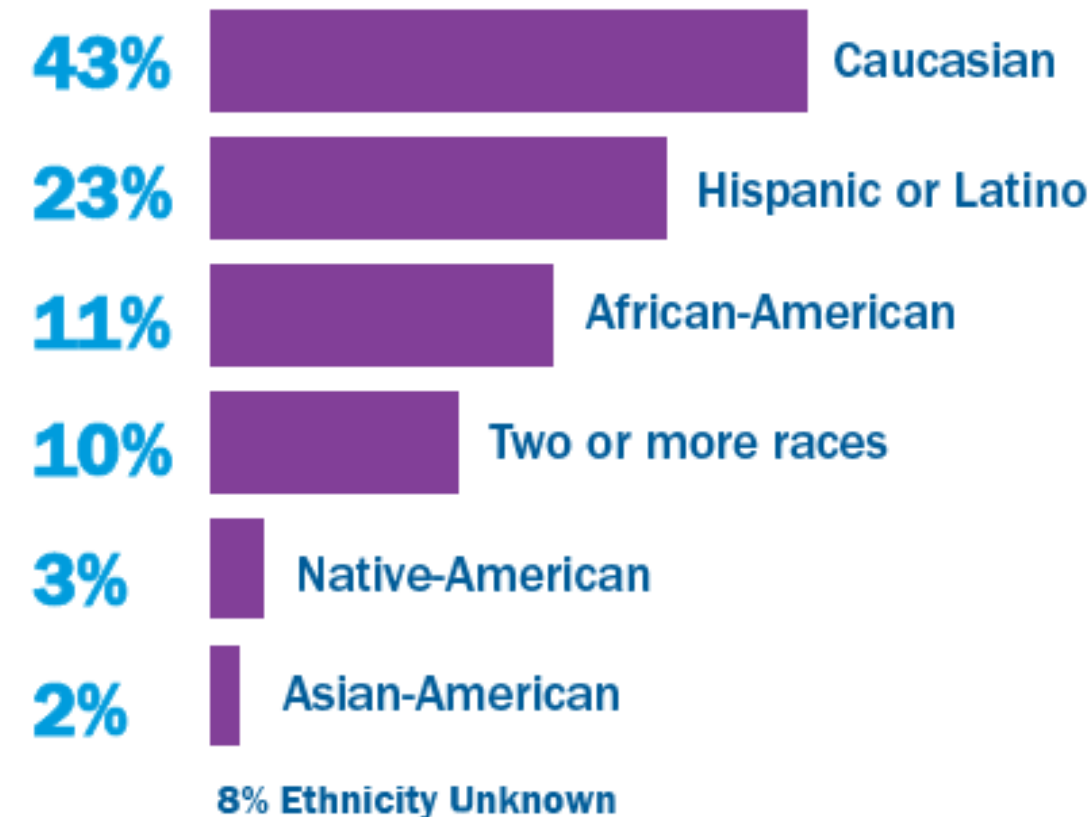
Annual Number of Meals/Snacks Served at No Cost

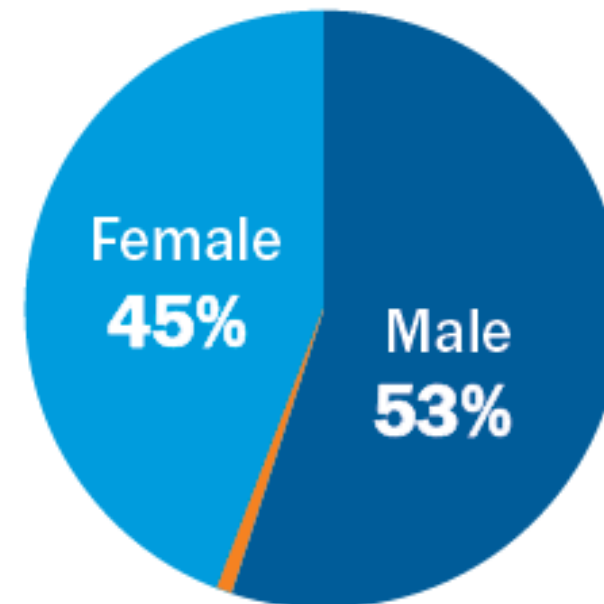

- **Evidenced-informed prevention program**, developed in partnership with Allstate Foundation and Kohl's Cares
- **Team delivery** involving staff, peer leaders, parents and community representatives
- **Discussion and role-playing of resilience and refusal skills, decision-making skills and analyzing media and peer influence via paced modules**
- **Promote abstinence** from opioids, marijuana and alcohol use through knowledge gains and responsible behavior
- **Effectiveness is measured** through pre- and post-tests
- **SAPTA certified**, ensuring integrity and consistency of program delivery and evaluation



FY24 & FY25 Deliverables

Goal 01

Build youth capacity for opioid use resilience in **2,971 Boys & Girls Clubs members ages 10 to 15 years old** by implementing the evidenced-informed prevention curricula SMART Moves in **34 neighborhoods/communities**.

Goal 02

Build staff capacity in **75 mentors** through professional development training, and orientation on opioid intervention tools and community resources.

Goal 03

Build Club capacity by increasing program effectiveness through the involvement of **320 families** attending **14 community events** featuring information, activities, community experts and resource.

TWEEN & TEEN IMPACT

Objective: Increase knowledge of opioid misuse impact, community resources and intervention resources in 2,971 youth

- **Pre and Post-test Result: 73%**

Objective: Increase youth recognition and resilience to peer and media pressures to substance misuse

- **Pre and Post-test Result: 91%**



STAFF AND CLUB IMPACT

Objective: Empower 75 staff through an increase in knowledge of effective opioid intervention strategies, including administering Naloxone/Narcan

- **Result: 271, 361% of goal**

Objective: Supply 10 or more Clubhouses with Naloxone/Narcan, dispense training and establish best practice policies

- **Result: 27, 270% of goal**



FAMILY & COMMUNITY IMPACT

Objective: Empower 320 families through 14 outreach events

- **Result: 724 families, 226% of goal**

Objective: Ensure community resources and referrals are accessible and current, engage community guest speakers

- **Result: Involvement of health districts, ambulance services, fire departments, sheriffs, hospitals and other first responders**



FY26 PENDING REQUEST

Expanding Age Range

- **Additional pool of 2,939 youth ages 8 and 9 years old, 26% of registered members**

Transportation Support

- **Reduce transportation barriers to Club attendance and program participation**

Community Outreach

- **Partnering with Equipo Charter School in Las Vegas**
 - **685 students**
- **Community Partnership Specialist**
 - **Create awareness by networking with other family service and education providers**
