**Re: Open Meeting Law Complaint - I Can Do Anything Charter
School Board, O.A.G. File No. 13897-311**

Dear Ms. Riggi:

The Office of the Attorney General (OAG) is in receipt of your complaint alleging a violation of the Open Meeting Law (OML) by the I Can Do Anything Charter School Board (Board). The Complaint alleges that the Board violated the OML by failing to post Board meeting minutes to the Board's website.

The OAG has statutory enforcement powers under the OML, and the authority to investigate and prosecute violations of the OML. NRS 241.037; NRS 241.039; NRS 241.040.

DISCUSSION AND LEGAL ANALYSIS

The Board is a "public body" as defined in NRS 241.015(4) and NRS 388A.320(4) and is subject to the OML. The OML requires that public bodies keep written minutes of each of their meetings and that those minutes are public records. NRS 241.035(1)-(2). Further, "[a] copy of the minutes or audio recording of a meeting must be made available to a member of the public upon request at no charge." NRS 241.035(2). While many public bodies choose to post minutes


to the public bodies' websites, the OML does not require that public bodies post copies of their minutes to the internet. Thus, your complaint does not allege a violation of the OML.

CONCLUSION

The OAG has reviewed the available evidence and determined that no violation of the OML has occurred. The OAG will close the file regarding this matter.
