SMALL BUSINESS IMPACT STATEMENT
FOR PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO:

NAC 228.110(1)(d); 228.110(1)(e); (228.110(1)(f); 228.110(7)(c); 228.110(7)(d)

1. A description of the manner in which comment was solicited from affected small businesses, a summary of their responses, and an explanation of the manner in which other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary.

The proposed amendments to NAC 228.110 is expected to have no adverse or beneficial immediate or long term effects on the businesses it is to regulate or the public at large. Comments were solicited from licensed providers of domestic violence treatment, interested parties, and

2. The manner in which the analysis was conducted.

All comments received were reviewed by the Committee during public workshop, held on April 21, 2016.

3. The estimated economic effect of the proposed regulation on the small businesses which it is to regulate including, without limitation:

(a) Both adverse and beneficial effects; and

The Committee does not foresee or expect any adverse or beneficial economic impacts upon the small businesses which it regulates.

(b) Both direct and indirect effects.

The Committee does not foresee or expect any direct or indirect economic benefits to the small businesses which it regulates.

4. A description of the methods that the agency considered to reduce the impact of the proposed regulation on small businesses and a statement regarding whether the agency actually used any of those methods. See NRS 233B.0608(2)(b).

The Committee had not identified any impact upon small businesses that will be caused by the proposed amendments to NAC 228.110.

5. The estimated cost to the agency for enforcement of the proposed regulation.

The Committee does not foresee any additional costs to enforce the proposed amendment to the regulation because the regulation is already in effect.

6. If the proposed regulation provides a new fee or increases an existing fee, the total annual amount the agency expects to collect, and the manner in which the money will be used.

The proposed amendment to NAC 228.110 does not provide for a new or increased fee.



The proposed amendments to NAC 228.110 does not include provisions which duplicate or are more stringent than existing federal, state, or local standards regulating the same activity.

8. The reasons for the conclusions of the agency regarding the impact of the regulation on small businesses.

The proposed amendments to NAC 228.110 will not create an impact upon small businesses. The proposed amendments simply eliminate course/training requirements which are currently unavailable and therefore prevent applicants from obtaining certification.
