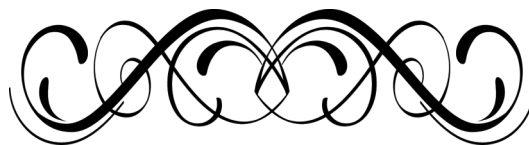

What is a Family Justice Center?

The Southern Nevada Family Justice Center (SNFJC) is a multi-agency center designed to help victims get their needs met in one safe place. Safety, advocacy and confidentiality are the foundation of the SNFJC.

Available Services:

- Temporary Housing
- Temporary Protection Orders
- Safety planning, counseling and advocacy
- Immigration assistance for victims of domestic violence and sexual assault, including U-VISA assistance
- Free legal aid advice including divorce, civil issues and financial matters
- Criminal justice advocacy and support

Victims' Rights in Nevada

- ◆ To know the status of the case in which you are involved
 - ◆ To be free from intimidation or dissuasion
- ◆ To know when your impounded property may be released.
- ◆ To receive a witness fee for lawful obedience to a subpoena.
- ◆ To understand the existing victim compensation laws and receive compensation if applicable.
- ◆ To a secure waiting area, which is not available to the defendant or his family, when you are at court.
 - ◆ To know when the defendant is released from county or city detention before or during trial.
- ◆ To know when the offender is released
