## **2. PUBLIC COMMENT**

-Ombudsman, Jamie Trevino stated to keep in mind that if anyone is interested in being a chairperson that we will vote at the next meeting. Responsibilities include but are not limited to, a couple meetings per year, update of what NV S.A.V.E. system is doing, talk about any data we want from NV S.A.V.E, any barriers that we are seeing.

## **3. FOR DISCUSSION**

Ombudsman, Jamie Trevino discussed that implantation on NV S.A.V.E is coming to a close but is not completely finished as there are still some minor barriers. JMS Vendor changeovers include Carson City who switched on the 20<sup>th</sup> and so far is doing well. Washoe County will be in process of switching over in July. Some rural areas are struggling with the JMS change because they have no internet access, so they are still using paper. We are making sure that all counties have access to manual booking releases so those rural counties can be integrated.

## **4. FOR DISCUSSION**

-Ombudsman Jamie Trevino discussed some barriers while implementing the NV S.A.V.E. system. She mentioned that the statewide shutdown affected many factors like 2 of the jails in Clark County was not giving us the data we needed, smaller counties such as Elko and Nye had to manually input data, and there was a long delay to get fully back online. Another barrier was Clark County fully restructured their IT Team without notifying us and data was not coming in correctly with the new people not having knowledge of how the new system worked so we had to pull data. Switching from the old data to the new caused a ton of data clean up that we are continuing to work on today although Jamie is the only one that has access to the system so she is the only one able to work on it at this time. NV S.A.V.E. is not a one stop shop and merging all avenues together is doable but it cost a lot of money and going from an open system to a closed one is unheard of.

-Ombudsman, Jamie Trevino opened the floor to questions on these barriers we are seeing and Elizabeth Abdur-Raheem asked how much manual work is required on the system and is it sustainable long term? Jamie answered that a lot of our tasks are related to call center issues who we have been working closely to. It's a full time job and currently she is going to ask for another new hire or continue getting assistance from Sylogist staff. Elizabeth wants the committee to encourage Jamie to gain a new hire so she is not being taken away from her other duties to focus on the system alone. Tammy Cutler stated that the process to get set up in NV S.A.V.E. can be a lot for some survivors to handle to some degree. Jamie answered that the shutdown required verification and survivors do have the option to set up by phone with the call center as well. It is important the system is secure because sometimes we would see advocates signing up for survivors and we'd prefer passwords stay with the survivors to control notifications. Jamie also opened the floor to take suggestions on how we can make the process of setting up with NV S.A.V.E. a little easier. Dakota Dobrzynski suggested a quick registration option and to create a profile later.

## **5. FOR DISCUSSION**

-Ombudsman, Jamie Trevino asked the committee if there was any suggestions on what kind data would be useful to be able to pull out of the system and Elizabeth Abdur-Raheem suggested pulling how many people are signing up each month, what is their preferred method of contact, and if there are multiple people following one person in the system.
