2. PUBLIC COMMENT

3. FOR DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION

The minutes were read from the April 14, 2026 meeting and approved as amended. Judge Patricia Lynch mentioned the only suggestion she has is spelling out RCCD for the public who don't know what that is.

4. FOR DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION

-Jamie Trevino, Nevada Office of the Attorney General, collected 26 judicial survey questions for the 2027 biennial legislative report from the committee. It was explained that the committee needed to vote for 10 of those questions to be sent to the AOC for our rural judges to review and answer on the biennial legislative report. Aaron Ford suggested Amy Wilson give input and refinement on this list as she would be the most helpful with the connections she has with the rural judges already, then we rank order of which questions each committee member likes the best and least, and Jamie will compile the results and present them to be voted on a 15-minute meeting prior to October's meeting.

5. FOR DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION

-Jamie Trevino, Nevada Office of the Attorney General, held discussion for the BDR 2027 legislative session however, Aaron Ford had to drop off for another meeting, so the committee was unable to vote due to incomplete quorum. Suggestions were made on topics such as a statute mentioning no contact orders as a condition of release, and mandatory training for judges who handle domestic violence cases, whether it's criminal or in the family court. Aaron Ford stated we didn't have to come up with the language today as he will reserve a BDR for us to eventually fill and vote on at the next October meeting.

6. FOR DISCUSSION

-Jamie Trevino, Nevada Office of the Attorney General, shared updates to the committee on subcommittee actions. The press release was sent out to the public with 6 positions available including, law enforcement, sexual assault survivors, judges, etc. The FRT committee had an inquiry from the maternity fatality review team (MMRC) to join forces which was accepted. Tyler Ingram mentioned trying to lump in modifying hearsay at preliminary hearings for survivors into the BDR reserve.
