FOUR IMPORTANT STEPS ALL IDENTITY THEFT VICTIMS SHOULD TAKE

FILE A REPORT WITH YOUR LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY AND APPLY FOR A NEVADA IDENTITY THEFT PROGRAM CARD.

By filing a police report, you will be eligible to apply for the Nevada Identity Theft Program Card. This program will help you work with creditors and law enforcement to identify that you are the victim of alleged wrongdoing committed using your good name.

CLOSE THE ACCOUNTS YOU KNOW OR BELIEVE HAVE BEEN TAMPERED WITH OR WRONGFULLY OPENED.

Call and speak with someone in the security or fraud department of the bank or credit card companies. Follow-up each call in writing and keep copies of these letters. If an identity thief has made charges to your account, ask the company to send you the forms to dispute the charges.

PLACE A FRAUD ALERT OR FREEZE ON YOUR CREDIT REPORTS AND REVIEW YOUR CREDIT REPORTS.

Fraud alerts can help prevent an identity thief from opening more accounts in your name. Contact one of the three credit reporting agencies (Equifax, Experian, or TransUnion) to place a fraud alert on your credit report. Once you request a fraud alert, you are entitled to a free credit report. Nevada law also allows victims of identity theft to request their credit records be frozen for free. The request must be made in writing to the three credit reporting agencies. The agencies have 5 days from receipt of the request to begin the freeze. The freeze ensures a consumer's credit information is not released and no new credit is issued without the consumer's approval.

FILE A COMPLAINT WITH THE FEDERAL TRADE COMMISSION (FTC).

Filing a complaint with the FTC will give law enforcement agencies across the nation important information to help them track down and stop identity thieves. The FTC may refer complaints to other agencies for further action, as well as investigate companies for violations of related laws. You can file a complaint on the FTC's website at www.consumer.gov/idtheft.

HOW THE NEVADA IDENTITY THEFT PROGRAM CAN HELP YOU

Recovering from identity theft can take time, money and patience. Some victims have lost job opportunities, been denied loans or been arrested for crimes they did not commit.

As a responsible consumer, you can take steps to manage your personal information and minimize the risk of becoming a victim of identity theft. When you deal with personal information, always take measures to protect its secrecy. However, even if you have been careful about protecting your personal information, an identity theft can still occur.

Should this happen to you, the *Nevada Identity Theft Program* can help.

The Nevada Identity Theft Program provides victims a way to show law enforcement and creditors they have reported the theft of their personal information. It can help in the process of repairing a victim's credit and identifying fraudulent criminal activity.

IDENTITY THEFT LAWS IN NEVADA

NRS 205.463 makes it a crime to use the personal identifying information of another individual with the intent to fraudulently obtain credit, property or services. It also takes into account computer and Internet technology by making it a crime to aid or abet another person in securing this personal identifying information. Anyone convicted of using another person's identity can be punished with up to twenty years in prison and a \$100,000 fine.

- 1. File a local police report and request a Nevada Identity Theft Application.
- 2. Complete the Application and mail it to one of the following Attorney General's Office locations:

3. After the application is mailed, please allow 4 to 6 weeks for notification as to whether you qualify for a Program Card.

- Proof of Social Security Number: (at least 2. one of the following) State License or ID with number listed; Social Security Card; U.S. Military Identification; Original DD-214 Military Separation Form; Social Security Benefits Documentation
