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The Position

Cybercrime Investigators in the Attorney General's Investigations Division perform criminal investigations and analysis involving a variety of highly specialized forensic examinations performed on electronic devices or networks that can be programmed or can store or convey information in any form that is used in suspected criminal violations of State and/or federal laws pertaining to a specific program or regulatory area which includes, but is not limited to, Medicaid fraud, workers' compensation fraud, consumer protection, public integrity, human trafficking, missing children, financial fraud, alleged criminal offenses committed by State officers or employees, Internet Crimes Against Children, terrorism, drug crimes, identity theft, crimes against persons or property, and all types of conflict of interest cases submitted by outside agencies.

This recruitment will be used to underfill the AG Cybercrime Investigator 2. Attorney General Cybercrime Investigators are sworn law enforcement personnel primarily assigned to casework involving a subject's use of cyberspace, cloud storage, computers, or mobile devices to carryout criminal activity. Cybercrime Investigators receive extensive training and are required to conduct forensic analysis of computers, mobile devices, cloud storage, and other smart devices. Cybercrime Investigators are assigned casework both as a lead investigator, and as a supporting investigator for casework assigned to other investigators. Investigative support work generally revolves around forensic analysis of digital devices or cloud data recovered during investigations. Casework generally includes, but is not limited to, complex criminal and civil investigations involving financial fraud, mortgage fraud, deceptive trade, consumer crimes, human trafficking, crimes against children, opioid crimes, public integrity, crimes by State employees, and a variety of conflict cases from local jurisdictions. In addition, Cybercrime Investigators work in conjunction with various task forces throughout the state with an emphasis on casework involving the use of technology, cyberspace, cloud storage, computers, or mobile devices to carryout criminal activity.

To Qualify

Education and Experience

1) Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university in computer science, information technology, computer forensics, criminal justice, police science, or closely related field; current, at a minimum, Category II POST certification in Nevada within one year of appointment and as a condition of continuing employment; and one year of criminal investigation and law enforcement experience involving standard investigative and enforcement techniques utilized to enforce local, State and/or federal and agency laws, preparation of detailed investigative reports, implementation of agency goals and objectives, and handling of digital evidence; OR graduation from high school or equivalent education; current, at a minimum, Category II POST certification in Nevada; and three years of experience as described above; OR one year of experience as an AG Criminal Investigator I or Criminal Investigator I in Nevada State service; OR an equivalent combination of education and experience as described above

Special Notes

- 1) Applicants must meet the minimum standards for appointment as a peace officer as established in the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) and Nevada Administrative Code (NAC).
- 2) AG Cybercrime Investigator I must obtain and maintain, at a minimum, Nevada POST Category II certification within one year of appointment and as a condition of continuing employment.
- 3) A bi-annual qualifying score of 80 or better with a firearm will be required.
- 4) Incumbents may be required to obtain and maintain a Top Secret National Security Clearance issued by the FBI.

Special Requirements

- 1) A valid driver's license is required at the time of appointment and as a condition of continuing employment.
- 2) Persons offered employment in this series must submit to a background, medical, and psychological evaluation.
- 3) AG Cybercrime Investigator I must obtain Certification by the International Association of Computer Investigative Specialists (IACIS) or Basic Computer Evidence Recovery Training (BCERT) at the National Computer Forensics Institute within 18 months of employment and as a condition of continuing employment.
- 4) As a condition of employment, pursuant to NRS 284.4066, this position has been identified as affecting public safety. Persons offered employment in this position must first submit to a pre-employment screening test for controlled substances.

Additional Position Criteria

- 1) This recruitment is only open to current classified employees in state service with at least six months of continuous, full-time equivalent service.

Application Evaluation Exam

The exam will consist of an application evaluation. It is essential that applications include detailed information with time frames regarding education and experience. The most qualified applicants will be contacted by the hiring agency for interview. The hiring agency may require specific skills related testing as part of the interviewing process.
