The above-named defendant presented at least two false insurance claims as a source of income with an intended loss to insurance companies of more than \$650. The complainant knows that said crimes occurred and that the above-named defendants committed the same based upon the following: Because the complainant is a Senior Deputy Attorney General, and is in possession of, among other things, an affidavit written by Investigator Ryan Evans, known to the complainant to be employed with the Office of the Attorney General, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference for the limited purpose of securing warrants of arrest.

The complainant hereby requests that a Summons in Lieu of Arrest be issued at this time, pursuant to NRS 171.106, as to Defendants, TAMEKA NICOLE GREEN, TIFFANY SHERRIE RUSSELL, LATRICE DENISE HALL, KASHEVA RASHAWN MCGRUDER, and CIBELEANA DENISA DRAIN. The complainant knows that said crimes occurred and that the above-named defendants committed the same based upon the following: Because the complainant is a Senior Deputy Attorney General, and is in possession of, among other things, an affidavit written by Investigator Ryan Evans, known to the complainant to be employed with the Office of the Attorney General, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference for the limited purpose of securing summons in lieu of arrest.

The complainant makes this declaration subject to the penalty for perjury.

- 1. RYAN EVANS, first being duly sworn, according to law, and based on information and belief, do hereby swear the assertions of this affidavit are true.
- That Affiant is employed as a Criminal Investigator II for the Nevada Attorney
 General's Office, Insurance Fraud Unit.
- 3. In support of the assertion to constitute the existence of probable cause, the following facts are offered.
- 4. On or about September 15, 2016, Debbie Robinett, Special Investigations Unit (SIU) Investigator with GEICO referred a complaint alleging insurance fraud to the Attorney General's Office. The complaint alleged NA VAR DERICK LEE a/k/a NAVAR DERICK LEE (hereinafter LEE, ID #8191341) reported to GEICO that he was struck by a 2002 Honda Civic sedan (hereinafter Civic) bearing NV plate 835-LSN and VIN #1HGES26702L018890 as he walked near Lone Mountain Rd. and Lawrence St. in North Las Vegas, Nevada. The Civic driver was Kiesha Maddox, and the accident occurred on 07/04/16 around 1:00 a.m. to 4:00 a.m. The alleged accident was filed under claim number 0403199610101068. During their investigation, GEICO discovered that LEE filed the claim using the alias Allen Davis, and conspired with Maddox to report an accident that never happened. Maddox eventually recanted and told GEICO their entire claim was fabricated. It was also discovered that LEE had a history of filing similar pedestrian claims with various insurance companies.
- 5. Maddox's mother (Dorine Maddox) had the Civic insured with GEICO. The policy number was 4206-49-21-28, with effective dates from June 15, 2016 December 15, 2016. Coverage for bodily injury was \$15,000, property damage liability \$10,000, with a \$500 collision deductible.
 - 6. On July 8, 2016, Maddox called GEICO to report her claim. She claimed the

pedestrian accident occurred on 07/04/16 around 2:30 a.m. at the stop sign near Lawrence and Lone Mountain. The male (note: she didn't provide his name) didn't want to call the police and walked away with a limp.

- On July 9, 2016, Maddox called the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department 7. (LVMPD) and reported LEE had threatened and extorted her into submitting a false insurance claim.
- 8. On or about July 12, 2016, the claim was referred to the GEICO SIU because Maddox said Allen Davis wasn't the real name of the claimant, and the accident never occurred. Maddox also claimed she was threatened.
- 9. On July 21, 2016, Allen Davis called GEICO regarding the accident claim, and it was recorded. Davis claimed he was walking when the accident occurred around 1:00 a.m. to 4:00 a.m. near Lone Mountain and Lawrence. Davis said he was injured, limped home, and woke up the next day in "excruciating pain." Davis claimed he had some X-rays taken at Desert Springs Hospital, received an ankle brace, and fractured his hand. Davis was asked if the information he provided was true and correct. He replied "yes, sir."
- 10. I listened to GEICO's audio recording of Allen Davis and compared it to LEE's voice from recorded interviews he provided in separate insurance claims with State Farm (10/11/15), USAA (11/22/15), GEICO (01/27/16), and Liberty Mutual (03/09/16). The voice of Allen Davis and LEE sounded similar.
- On July 21, 2016, GEICO Investigator Robinett called Davis' phone: 702-500-11. 3376 for a follow up interview. Davis indicated he wanted to settle the claim without further delays.
- On or about July 22, 2016, Davis faxed his medical documents from Desert 12. Springs Hospital to GEICO in support of his claim. Davis visited the hospital on 07/06/16, almost two days after the alleged accident. The records indicated Davis complained of pain in his left shoulder, left knee, and left wrist. He provided the address: 1012 Mezpah St. Las Vegas, NV 89106, and DOB: 08/02/85.
 - On July 26, 2016, GEICO Investigator Robinett interviewed Maddox regarding 13.

her claim. In summary:

- Maddox first met LEE on 07/03/16 through the dating website Plenty of Fish.
- She picked LEE up in her Civic around midnight, visited her mother's residence, became intimate, and returned him to his residence at the Emerald Suites. However, LEE would not exit her vehicle and eventually threatened Maddox into filing a false insurance claim. LEE told Maddox what to say and she called GEICO to report the false claim while he remained in her car.
- After Maddox reported the claim to GEICO, LEE exited her vehicle and said all he had to do was call GEICO and claim he was involved. LEE also told Maddox she couldn't go back on what she said.
- LEE told Maddox she would get in trouble for filing a false claim, and LEE didn't provide his information so he wouldn't be in trouble.
- LEE claimed to know the law and never used his own information "so he doesn't get his hands dirty."
- LEE said he provided his friend's identity (note: Allen Davis) to GEICO and if Maddox got him in trouble Davis would hurt Maddox and her family. Davis was going to cash the insurance check and share the money with LEE.
- Investigator Robinett viewed text messages from LEE talking about how people get killed when they snitch and that he used to "bully and beat up snitches."
- Investigator Robinett noted in her report the following texts were sent by LEE to Maddox on 07/11/16 from his number 626-376-3878 [sic]:
- Why you ignoring me, WYD. I wanted to hear your voice, you want me to erase your number. I actually had some good news for you but if you're still on some other shit let me know, I really need your bank info, I have a idea, I got \$13,000 coming, put in your bank, I'll give it to you half the money now instead of waiting on the case to finish that way you can't say you don't trust me, you gonna have your money now so I am giving you \$6,500 so we can be done with this and you realize I am a real man, I don't lie, when I say I got you I really mean that, about to settle with the insurance, call me, so you ignoring me and I am trying to tell you I talked to the insurance and I settled, so you don't want your money?, I dont want you to say I am a shady person, I am not gonna beg you, it's a lot of money so hit me I know you need it I am a man of my word, when you get these thousands in your hand you just want an apology, I am sorry for the arguing, you were sweet to me and I was in an angry place, it wasn't you it was me, I miss you friend I would never hurt you or play you, if you don't want it at least get it for your son.'

- On or about July 28, 2016, Investigator Robinett did a database search with the 14. phone number 626-376-3878, and located a match for LEE. I also did a database search for LEE and the phone number 626-376-3878 returned as a possible match. Furthermore, a www.spydialer.com phone search revealed the name "Navar" near Pasadena, CA.
- On July 28, 2016, Investigator Robinett called Davis and requested an interview. He declined, and told her she was legally obligated to tell him about her investigation. Investigator Robinett disagreed, but Davis claimed he knew because he was a lawyer.
- On or about September 27, 2016, GEICO denied Davis' claim because their 16. investigation revealed the accident "did not take place."
- On January 9, 2018, I tried calling LEE for an interview with the number 626-17. 376-3878, but the number was no longer in service. I called various other numbers for LEE but was unsuccessful.
- On January 10, 2018, I telephonically interviewed Maddox regarding Davis' 18. claim. In summary:
 - On or about July 3, 2016, Maddox met LEE online through the dating website www.pof.com (Plenty of Fish). They hung out for a while, and LEE told her to file a fake insurance claim regarding her Civic.
 - Maddox owned her Honda Civic outright, but was insured under her Mom's (Dorine Maddox) GEICO policy.
 - LEE and Maddox had a brief intimate relationship for one night, and LEE lived in a Budget or Siegel Suites near Paradise or Swenson St. in Las Vegas. LEE traveled back and forth between California and Nevada.
 - **LEE** told Maddox to tell GEICO that she hit a guy called "Allen Davis" with her Civic. Maddox thought Davis might have been LEE's friend living in Las Vegas, but she never met Davis or knew if he was a real person. Allen Davis would be LEE's alias, and LEE explained he did a lot of insurance scams using aliases.
 - LEE told Maddox this is what he did for money (filing fake insurance claims) and that is how he lived. LEE didn't say how long or how much money he had

previously received, but claimed he did the scam with various insurance companies. LEE told her he knew the law and knew what he was doing. It appeared to Maddox that LEE was operating alone.

- For the scam, LEE provided Maddox the cross streets (near Lone Mountain & Lawrence) in North Las Vegas and told her to say she accidentally hit Allen Davis on the right side of her Civic as he was walking around 3 a.m. on 07/04/16.
- LEE was sitting next to Maddox in her Civic (outside his residence at Budget or Siegel Suites) when she initially called GEICO to report the fictitious claim.
- Initially, Maddox didn't want to go through with the scam, and hadn't done something like that in her life. However, LEE started threatening her right away, and was very aggressive. LEE physically threatened Maddox and said he would kill her and her son (currently, about 8 years old). Maddox was overwhelmed and scared of LEE, but still reported the phony claim to GEICO.
- Sometime later, Maddox heard LEE call GEICO and claim he was Allen Davis.
- A few days later, Maddox told GEICO and her mother Dorine the truth about the scam. Maddox eventually helped a GEICO Investigator regarding her claim.
- Maddox said she never submitted any documents to GEICO and didn't know if LEE did.
- Maddox stopped seeing LEE about a week after they met. However, LEE continued to text her for about a month. Maddox filed a police report against LEE with the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department (LVMPD).
- According to Maddox, LEE is a very aggressive person, and he did not have a car LEE is high maintenance, and she didn't know his current when they met. whereabouts.
- Maddox was willing to testify in court against LEE.
- 19. On January 18, 2018, Investigator K. Huss and I interviewed Allen Davis at the Clark County Detention Center (CCDC) regarding the 07/04/16 claim. Davis was in custody, and was read his Miranda rights. He agreed to talk with us, and allowed the interview to be

recorded. In summary:

- Davis stated he lost his Driver's License twice in 2016. The first time it occurred was in the beginning of 2016, and the second time was right after his birthday.
- Sometime around June or July 2016, Davis visited the hospital because he slammed the door on his foot "real bad" when he was playing with his twin daughters. He incurred a limp, and also messed up his hand from a fight. Davis said his foot injury was at home, but the fight occurred outside.
- Davis explained he was running behind his young twin daughters and slammed his foot in the door. Davis did not injure his knee or shoulder, just his foot, and he visited Desert Springs Hospital. Davis thought the incident might have occurred around the first of the year.
- Davis has not visited the hospital since that time in 2016. His hand injury occurred maybe a couple of months later, but he didn't see a doctor, or receive medical attention. Davis claimed he had been in a lot of fights, and his hand was swollen.
- Davis has not filed any insurance claims in the last two years "none." He has not helped anyone file an insurance claim, and nobody has asked him to file a claim. "I don't do scams or nothin' like that."
- Nobody has asked Davis to file a fake claim in the last two years. Davis believed quick scheme money would "go too fast" and you "don't get no justice out of it."
- In 2016, Davis lived at 1012 Mezpah Las Vegas, NV 89106. It's an address he's used for years, and his aunt (Evelyn Fitzgerald) has lived there a long time. Davis frequently moves.
- Davis' cell phone provider in 2016 was T-Mobile, and his number was 702-969-6091.
- Shirley Banks is Davis' mother, and Tori Carter is his girlfriend of 11 years. Carter's phone: 702-809-7454.
- Davis was not employed in 2016. He cult hair as a barber at his house, and he did not have health insurance. He survived with help from his girlfriend.

- Davis has never filed a claim with GEICO.
- Davis reiterated he has not helped someone out with an insurance claim, and nobody has asked him to file a fake claim.
- Davis did not know LEE "hell no." He was shown a black and white photo of LEE's California Driver's License and did not recognize him.
- We told Davis there were discrepancies with his story. Davis said it was his ID that we showed him from his visit to Desert Springs Hospital. Davis stated he visited for the injury to his foot, not his hand. He thought he received stitches to his hand from a preexisting injury possibly in 2015 to his pinkie finger.
- We read the Desert Springs Hospital report from the 07/06/16 visit about pain to his left shoulder, left knee, and left wrist. Davis also reported being struck by a vehicle. Davis replied: "I don't remember that."
- According to Davis, somebody backed up into his leg at his apartment. He claimed it was an "old white lady." She hit his right leg or something, and he forgot about it. Davis did not file any insurance claim for the accident, and claimed the unknown female "barely even tapped me." His knee wasn't swollen. The accident occurred where Davis was staying at 1413 Silver Mesa Circle. The 80 year old female hit his foot, and nothing happened with his shoulder. Davis did not call the police, was not hurt, and the female "barely even touched me." He claimed that's why he visited the hospital.
- Davis was living at 1413 Silver Mesa with his daughters, and didn't recall talking to GEICO.
- Davis said he got bumped, and his knee was hurting. The accident occurred at night time around 8 p.m. The "sun probably had been down maybe 30 minutes, 40 minutes, or something like that." It wasn't 2:00 a.m. or 3:00 a.m. "no, hell no." The female was driving a small car like a silver or white Nissan Sentra. They didn't call the police, and Davis didn't get her information because he wasn't hurt. He had a minor bruise to his leg. Davis reiterated it was "barely, a barely, barely tap." They

took X-rays of his left foot, and hand.

- Davis repeated he did not know LEE and did not recognize his picture.
- I asked Davis how LEE would know his information and he alleged maybe LEE found his ID or stole it from his car. "I don't know him."
- Davis indicated GEICO most likely recorded their conversation with whoever filed the claim.
- Davis was shown the faxed Desert Springs Hospital document sent to GEICO on 07/22/16. He said it wasn't his "handwriting." Davis claimed his credit report listed about \$10,000 in past medical bills.
- Davis said he was done talking to us, wanted an attorney, and he did not do scams.
 He reaffirmed the lady "barely tapped me," it felt like playing with his daughters, and it was nothing.
- 20. On January 17, 2018, I visited the records department at Desert Springs Hospital to see what ID was provided to the hospital for Davis' 07/06/16 visit. Their record clearly showed Davis' Nevada Driver's License.
- 21. On February 13, 2018, I visited Desert Springs Hospital again to see who signed Davis' medical records disclosure form dated 07/07/16. Davis listed the reason for releasing his records was "for insurance." Although Davis denied being involved with **LEE** regarding any insurance claims, the only logical conclusion from the information obtained from the hospital was that Davis provided his medical records to **LEE**, who then provided them to GEICO.
- 22. During the course of my investigation, I discovered **LEE** had additional insurance claims that were similar to the aforementioned GEICO claim. **LEE** claimed injuries from five additional pedestrian accidents located within the Las Vegas area from 2015-2016 (see below). I also discovered the National Insurance Crime Bureau (NICB) had approximately 30-40 pedestrian accident claims pending against **LEE** and his possible coconspirators in California and Nevada. It's possible **LEE** is associated with a staged pedestrian accident ring.

- On February 14, 2018, Investigator K. Huss and I interviewed Tameka Green (ID #5008921) at her work regarding the accident. Green was not in custody, agreed to being recorded, and provided the following information. In summary:
- Green recalled the pedestrian accident on 05/20/15 with "Mr. LEE." She did not meet LEE before the accident occurred, and didn't know him at any time prior to the accident.
- Green struck LEE with her vehicle sometime at night. She didn't see him, and heard something hit her vehicle. Green exited her vehicle and saw LEE on the ground. Green provided her address and insurance information to LEE. LEE said he was fine and he didn't need the police or paramedics.
- LEE did not appear to be injured, and told Green he was ok. LEE just "stood there" after Green gave him all her information and left the scene.
- At the time of the accident, Green had insurance with State Farm. She couldn't recall the cross streets of where the accident occurred. Green thought it was in North Las Vegas.
- The vehicle involved in the accident was Green's black 2014 Jeep Patriot. She still uses the Jeep.
- Green did not call the police regarding the accident. LEE seemed adamant about not contacting the police, and said he was fine.

- LEE didn't say where he was injured, and Green didn't see any damage to her Jeep.
- Green didn't know if her insurance rate increased, but switched insurance carriers after her premium expired.
- Prior to the accident, Green had left her grandmother's home. Her grandmother lived near Tropical and Clayton. Green was on her way to the Walmart on Ann and Simmons.
- Green didn't know how much money LEE received from the insurance claim. Green said the accident was not staged, or planned. Green stated she had never been asked to stage an accident or file a false insurance claim.
- Green did not receive any money from the 05/20/15 accident.
- Green recognized a black and white Driver's License photo of LEE.
- She did not find the accident suspicious, and Green was scared. Green did not receive any money from LEE, and he did not ask her to file a fake claim.
- Green restated the 05/20/15 accident with LEE was legitimate. Green didn't think it was suspicious, and she was "really, like banicking."
- On May 2, 2018, Investigator L. Rosel and I did a follow-up interview with Green at her residence. Green was not in custody, agreed to being recorded, and provided the following information. In summary:
- Initially, Green said she wasn't in a relationship with LEE before the purported accident (note: 05/20/15). We told Green we didn't believe her story and that she already knew LEE.
- Green eventually admitted she knew LEE, but after the accident. LEE called Green and asked if he could take her on a date. Green acknowledged meeting LEE online through Plenty of Fish (note: www.pof.com).
- LEE and Green dated about 3-4 months, and he lived at the apartment complex about a month. LEE is not the father of her newborn baby girl.

- LEE proposed to Green that he could get money.
- Green acknowledged the 05/20/15 accident was fictitious, and they (LEE & Green) planned it a couple weeks beforehand.
- LEE said he had been in a previous accident, and it was easy for him to get money.
- LEE did not provide a dollar amount to Green as her portion of the insurance payout. Green did not receive any money, and did not request any money.
- Green explained she helped LEE because he was going to be homeless, and he didn't have any friends.
- According to Green, LEE told her to pick a street and say that Green hit him. LEE told her what to say when Green called her insurance company. LEE wasn't present when Green called her insurance company, but he wrote instructions on a piece of paper for Green. The paper provided details about what to say with the insurance company.
- LEE told Green he had experience doing these things. She thought LEE might have done it on two previous occasions in California, but she wasn't sure.
- Green last spoke to **LEE** years ago after they had stopped dating. Initially, they met approximately two weeks before the 05/20/15 fictitious accident online through Plenty of Fish. She stopped communicating with LEE about two months after the claim.
- Green had to change her number because LEE was "hounding" her. She explained LEE was hounding her online, and through emails. Green believed LEE acted this way because he wanted to "use" Green again.
- When Green met LEE he was living with some people (NU) at a house near Craig and Lamb. She didn't think LEE had a vehicle at the time.
- Green acknowledged LEE requested help from her by creating a fake insurance claim to get some money.
- According to Green, LEE was not working when she knew him. Green asked LEE why he didn't work, and LEE replied "he don't wanna work."

- Green was shown a black and white photo of a Nevada Identification Card of LEE and identified him.
- **LEE** and Green were in a relationship approximately three months, and were intimate. They did not live together, but he had previously stayed overnight.
- Green said LEE "was a user" and he threatened her. She explained they had been in physical fights with each other and LEE said he would "beat my ass."
- Green reconfirmed the 05/20/15 accident with her Jeep Patriot never occurred.
- We discussed Green's 11/21/15 pedestrian accident claim (note: State Farm) with Sojourner Marable.
- At that time, Green wasn't speaking with LEE anymore, but he had introduced Green to Marable. Green acknowledged LEE was not involved in her accident with Marable, and the accident was fictitious.
- Marable told Green to say that Green backed into her.
- Marable suggested that Green should date Lee again, but Green declined.
- Marable told Green that she didn't want to move back to California, that she lost her job, and needed money. Green felt bad for Marable and went along with the claim.
- Marable did not offer Green any money as her cut from the insurance claim, but did give \$200 in cash to Green.
- Marable didn't tell Green how long she had been conducting these types of scams, or who trained her.
- At the time, Marable was living alone with her two kids (boy & girl) in Las Vegas.
- Green thought Marable used to date LEE, but she wasn't sure. Green last spoke to Marable around the beginning of 2017.
- According to Green, LEE tried to have Marable contact Green on his behalf.
- Marable was with Green when Green contacted State Farm. Green put State Farm on speakerphone so Marable could hear! Marable would write down what to say on paper notes to Green.
- Green didn't ask Marable if she was paid from the claim, but figured Marble was

Green reconfirmed the 11/21/15 accident

- Green reconfirmed the 11/21/15 accident was fictitious. Marable and Green planned it sometime around Halloween (or about three weeks prior).
- Marable lived in an apartment complex near Flamingo and Maryland Parkway with her two young kids (Journey and Harley. Their father was known as Hoddy or Hoddie, but she didn't know his real name). Green stated Marable moved a lot.
- Green said she felt bad about everything and did these claims because she felt threatened by LEE, and wanted to help out Marable.
- Green stated she would apologize to State Farm, and was willing to pay a fine.
- Green was willing to testify until the end against LEE and Marable. She was a little scared of LEE.
- Green said she wasn't truthful in her previous interview regarding LEE because she

- On April 24, 2018, Investigator L. Rosel and I did a follow-up interview with Russell at her residence. She was not in custody, and agreed to have the interview recorded. In summary:
- Russell initially stated she didn't know the male (NU) she hit in the purported 10/11/15 accident. She was shown a black and white photo of a CA Driver's License (note: Navar LEE) and identified him as the pedestrian in the accident.
- Russell stated she was driving a 2004 Chevrolet Venture van late at night when the accident occurred.
- Russell was asked what part of her vehicle was struck by the pedestrian. She stopped, started crying, and said "I can't. he lied, he made me lie... can't lie." Russell said the accident never happened. She explained she was "in a bind," and was a single mom with six kids. Russell was about to be evicted, and the pedestrian approached her explaining this is what he did. He told Russell she would "get part of whatever the money was." However, eventually he "disappeared" and she didn't know what happened to him.
- Russell said the pedestrian's name was Navar (LNU). She met Navar online through Plenty of Fish (note: www.pof.com). They initially talked approximately two days before the reported accident on 10/11/15. Russell told Navar about her life and how she had to raise six kids. Navar came up with a "solution" and asked her do "you want to make some money?"
- Navar eventually met Russell in person and "made me call in the accident." Navar told her to "pick a street." Russell agreed, and acknowledged picking the streets of Chevenne Ave. and North 5th Street in North Las Vegas. Navar told her to pick a street close to him as if he was walking home.
- Navar told her that he lived with a police officer. Russell did not go inside his residence, but sat on his porch (discussed below).
- As the claim continued, Russell said peoble called her, came out to take pictures, and she didn't want to take part in it anymore. She claimed Navar forced her to fax

papers and pick things up for him.

- Navar specifically told Russell to tell the insurance company that she hit Navar, and he provided Russell a story.
- Navar did not specify a dollar amount that Russell would receive, but said he would call her when the money "come through." Navar stated he had previous experience, that's how he got paid, and that's what he does. Navar claimed it would work, and showed Russell his Facebook pictures with lots of money and said "this is how I live."
- When Russell called State Farm she was on Navar's porch at his apartment near the cross streets of Cheyenne and MLK. Navar coaxed, and whispered to Russell while she talked to State Farm. Russell became nervous.
- Navar had started planning the fictitious accident approximately two days before it was reported. Navar didn't specify any amount to Russell, just that he would get her some money.
- Russell and Navar did not date, and she met him a few times after the accident was reported to fax papers. Navar told Russell he had to visit the hospital and have it put on paper that he was injured. Russell thought, "well, you're not." At that time, Navar demanded so much from Russell and she stopped caring.
- Navar advised Russell what to say if they (note: State Farm) called her. Navar did not say how long he had been doing these types of things.
- Russell and Navar did not have an intimate relationship, and he did not threaten her. Navar's approach to Russell was like "this is what we gonna do."
- Sometime after State Farm took pictures of Russell's van to verify the damage (there wasn't any), she didn't hear from Navar anymore. Russell thought she and Navar stopped communicating about 2-3 weeks after the fictitious accident. Russell waited for Navar to call her, but he never did and she eventually forgot about it until Investigator Evans called.
- Russell didn't know how much money Navar received from the insurance payout.

- Russell reiterated the accident was made up and never occurred.
- Russell regretted her actions, and was willing to testify in court to clear her name. Russell said she was not afraid of Navar, and was willing to cooperate until the end.
- At the time of the purported accident, Russell did not know insurance fraud was a felony. However, Russell understands now, and acknowledged Navar wouldn't have received any money if she hadn't participated. Russell stated she would apologize to State Farm for being so "naïve."
- According to Russell, she had limited income at the time, and Navar knew she had six kids. That's the only reason she did it "to keep a roof over our head. That's it."
- Navar didn't appear to have a car, and needed rides and money from Russell. He might have had a motorcycle.
- Navar told Russell he was dating a female police officer (NU) and "she was in on it, I guess." Their apartment was located near or behind a gas company possibly by Cheyenne and MLK. Navar did not say what type of police officer she was, or how long they had been dating.
- We discussed State Farm's claim note on 10/16/15 at 12:05 PM PDT with Jason Glasgow. Russell couldn't remember, but thought she called in using her phone.
- Navar told Russell to tell State Farm that she didn't call the police, and that she heard a bump on the right side of her van from the purported accident.
- Russell said Navar "made it sound so convincing" and flashed his money on Facebook videos. Russell felt Navar took advantage of her, but was grateful she didn't receive any money.

- Around 8:00 p.m. on 11/22/15, Hall was driving home in her 2007 GMC Yukon SUV (hereinafter GMC). She was near the cross streets of Craig Rd. and Lamont St. in North Las Vegas.
- Hall was driving alone in her GMC, and it was dark outside (but not too dark). She was stopped at the four way stop sign at the intersection. Hall noticed a male in her passenger mirror on the sidewalk. Hall said the male also looked at her. When Hall started to make the corner turn (traveling maybe 1 mph) she heard a boom on her GMC. Hall stopped and got out to see the same male (NU) from the sidewalk. She described him as a black male, approximately 5'7, and with short hair.
- Hall did not see the male hit her GMC. She saw him just before and after the accident occurred. Hall said there were no dents or damages to her GMC.
- Hall immediately became suspicious of the accident and opined the male walked into her big GMC. She said, "how could you miss it?" She did not question the male about her suspicions, but asked if he was ok. The male refused an ambulance, medical treatment, and did not want Hall to call the police. The male told Hall "it's cool" and did not specify any part of his body was injured. Hall said he appeared fine, and did not appear to be limping when he walked away.
- The male appeared to be alone, and Hall didn't recall any additional witnesses.

- Hall mentioned she was nervous and the location was in a sketchy neighborhood. She couldn't recall if she provided her phone number, but did not provide her insurance card to the male. Hall gave her name and alleged maybe the male filed a claim with her insurance after seeing her license plate.
- Hall didn't know what to do since the male repeatedly refused any help, and she called USAA to report the accident.
- Hall heard from USAA that about \$13,000 was paid on the claim. She didn't know if her insurance premium increased.
- On April 25, 2018, Investigator Gina Lovero and I did a follow-up interview with Hall at the Attorney General's Office. Hall was not in custody, and agreed to have the interview recorded. In summary:
- Initially, Hall acknowledged the pedestrian accident was legitimate and she couldn't remember the male pedestrian's name.
- Hall said she had five profiles on Plenty of Fish (note: www.pof.com). She actively started using it in 2016. Hall may have added pictures prior to 11/22/15, but didn't utilize the website.
- Hall acknowledged insurance fraud is a felony and it's wrong.
- We told Hall that we believed the accident never occurred and that she knew the male pedestrian before the purported accident. Hall admitted she met the male pedestrian one time, and initially he wanted to meet her to say "hi." Hall agreed, and explained she was recently divorced at the time.
- The male got into Hall's Yukon SUV and told her they could make some money. Hall said it sounded like a scam and told him, no, and that she was ok. The male told Hall he would show her how, but Hall declined and said she worked and didn't need additional income.
- The male asked Hall which insurance company she used, and she replied USAA. He instructed Hall to call them on the telephone, and "tell them what I tell you to tell

- Hall was nervous talking to the female insurance representative and explained the male already told her that he had tons of money and guns. Hall stated she was "scared...for my life."
- The male told Hall: "tell her exactly what I tell you to say and you won't have a problem...and if I call you that just mean's you need to answer me, and if I respond to you in any way, or contact you, you need to tell me what I need to know so that I can get money." Hall responded, "what, am I doing?" The male told Hall to call her insurance.
- Hall didn't know if the female insurance representative picked up on her dilemma, and repeatedly asked if Hall was ok and needed the police. Hall couldn't really ask her, because the male was listening behind Hall. The male eventually told Hall to put their conversation on speaker so he could hear the female representative. Hall fumbled her words with the representative.
- The male pedestrian did not physically threaten Hall, but reiterated he had guns. He told Hall he "needed to get this money, and he was going to get it." Hall interpreted this as a threat, because she didn't know him.
- Hall acknowledged the claim was made up, and did not happen.
- The day Hall reported the fictitious accident was the day the male was in her vehicle. Hall wasn't certain if she met the male on Plenty of Fish, but they eventually exchanged phone numbers and met. She couldn't recall his name.
- Hall was shown a black and white CA Driver's License photo (note: Navar LEE) and thought he looked like the male she spoke with in her SUV. On a scale of 1-10, she gave him a 7.
- The male specifically told Hall to tell the insurance company the following:
 - That he was on the sidewalk and walked off and basically into her vehicle.
 - Hall was making a turn and hit him.

- He wasn't bleeding, and he didn't have injuries.
- To hurry up and file/process the claim, and get off the phone.
- The male did not ask Hall to fax any documents on his behalf to USAA.
- The male often sent text messages to Hall about needing gas money, and how he was stuck somewhere. Hall told him to leave her alone, that he was a complete stranger, and she didn't want anything to do with him. Hall didn't have the text messages anymore, and did not receive any emails from him.
- Hall knew the male for approximately 1-2 weeks. They were not boyfriend and girlfriend, and did not have an intimate relationship.
- The male told Hall she would receive "half of the check" from the claim payout, but Hall told him she didn't need it because she was already employed. The male told Hall he knew what to do, and had done it before. He explained he did it every 3-6 months and traveled from California, Nevada, and Arizona. Hall asked him "what do you call this?" He replied, "fake insurance claims." Hall questioned him, "I just filed a fake fucking claim with my insurance because you're a scam artist?" The male said he'd give Hall half the check, but Hall declined because she didn't know what he was doing. The male replied, "I do this all the time, and it's easy, it's a legit scam, and this is how I got my cars, my duns, and my money."
- He also told Hall he had friends and family (NU) in California that did it. Hall thought it sounded like it was his immediate family.
- The male told Hall he had been doing pedestrian insurance scams about 3-5 years. He explained, in most states, if a car hits a person, the person automatically wins. He claimed to know the law, and knew exactly what he was doing because he did it before in California. He claimed to have received about \$30,000-\$32,000.
- Hall initially met the male at Del Taco on Vegas Blvd and Nellis nearby the old Walmart. He showed up in a white BMW SUV with really big rims and a California license plate.
- Hall described the male as skinny, with tattoos (possibly on his neck), black,

possibly pierced ears, and had layers of clothing.

- After the claim was reported to Halls insurance, the male told Hall he did insurance scams.
- According to Hall, when she first met the male at Del Taco he quickly started talking about the insurance scam. Hall found that "hella odd" and wondered how she was going to get the man out of her vehicle.
- The male did not tell Hall how much money he received from the insurance claim, and couldn't recall his phone number.
- Hall's insurance premium increased significantly after the fictitious claim and she had to switch companies.
- Hall called her insurance company after the claim was filed, but was unable to get in contact with the same female representative who started the claim. The primary policy holder was her ex-husband Torry Hall. They were divorced on 06/05/15.
- 'Hall regretted her actions, and said the male was aggressive and intimidating since he was sitting behind Hall in her SUV.
- Hall thought the male texted her approximately a month after the fictitious accident claiming he was living out of a car, and got beat up in Las Vegas. Hall stopped paying attention and didn't want anything to do with him.
- When Hall previously spoke with Investigator Evans telephonically, she couldn't say
 what she wanted because she was with
 some people and they would have made
 inquiries.
- Hall did not receive any money from the claim.
- Hall said she would apologize to USAA, and would take it back if she could.

 Because Hall "had a kid" she felt threatened and scared for her life.
- Hall was willing to testify in court.
- Hall felt the male used her, but she was not desperate for money at the time of the claim.
- Hall stated she initially met the male so she could go on a date, but he didn't turn

out like she expected.

The male told Hall that he used to date a female law enforcement officer (NU) and she "partook as well." He mentioned they dated about two years before Hall's claim on 11/22/15. - On February 2, 2018, Investigator L. Rosel and I interviewed Kasheva McGruder (ID #6036366) at her residence. She provided the following information. summary:
- McGruder still has her 2007 Nissan Altima (hereinafter Altima) that was involved in the accident. There wasn't any major damage from the incident.
- The accident occurred around 9:30-10:00 p.m. in North Las Vegas. She couldn't remember the major cross streets. McGruder was alone and on her way home.
- She was about to turn, felt a thump, parked, and got out to assist the male. McGruder couldn't remember his name. McGruder asked him if he was ok, apologized, and offered to call the police. The male said he was fine, and started walking. The male also limped a little bit.
- McGruder gave him her full name and insurance. The male reiterated he was fine, and was alone. There were not any additional witnesses.
- McGruder was making a right turn at the stop sign. She did not see anyone just prior to the accident. The collision occurred near the front passenger area of her

Altima, and she thought he was hit in his upper thigh area.

- McGruder never met him prior to the accident.
- The male was standing up right after the accident. McGruder offered to call the police, and the man started to walk away.
- McGruder thought the accident was weird, and thought it was staged. He appeared to come out of nowhere. McGruder didn't question him about her suspicions because she was scared.
- The male was adamant about not calling the police or an ambulance.
- McGruder was the registered owner of the Altima, and her insurance rate increased \$10-\$15.
- The accident occurred about 5-15 minutes from her residence.
- We showed McGruder a black and white CA Driver's License photo (note: Navar Lee) and she recognized him as the man in the accident. She couldn't recall his name.
- The man appeared homeless and was described as skinny, black, and wearing baggy clothing. She did not see any visible tattoos.
- The man did not provide his phone number to McGruder, and the scene of the accident had street lights.
- On April 24, 2018, Investigator L. Rosel and I did a follow-up interview with McGruder at the Attorney General's Office. McGruder was not in custody, and agreed to have the interview recorded. In summary:
- McGruder stated she previously used the website Plenty of Fish (note: www.pof.com) around the beginning of 2017.
- McGruder reiterated she never met the male she struck with her vehicle before the accident.
- We questioned McGruder about some discrepancies from our previous interview. She eventually said she had previously known the male she purportedly hit, and

apologized.

- The male told her it was his "second time of doing this." Sometime after the purported accident McGruder stopped contacting him. McGruder told him she didn't want to go through with it, and knew something would come back to bite her.
- McGruder thought one of the two previous claims was possibly done in L.A. He told McGruder he already had a claim before he came to Las Vegas, she thought he was from L.A. McGruder couldn't remember his name (note: she later called him Lavar), but stated she knew who he was.
- She originally met him on Plenty of Fish. He told McGruder he had an idea, and had previously done it twice in L.A. He claimed both claims went through and explained how he received the money.
- McGruder believed he contacted GEICO the same week they talked to McGruder. She eventually told him "I'm not a criminal, I can't do this." He did not specify a dollar amount, but told McGruder she would receive 50% as her cut of the insurance payout. He initially offered McGruder this amount to entice her, but McGruder told him she didn't want anything and it was wrong. The male replied she wouldn't get into trouble, but McGruder believed she would because she filed the claim.
- The male and McGruder were dating at the time of the claim.
- McGruder acknowledged the 01/27/16 pedestrian accident was fabricated and never occurred.
- They both met approximately two months prior to the purported 01/27/16 accident.
- He claimed two other females (NU) had helped him with claims when he used to live in L.A. He did not tell McGruder who trained him on filing insurance claims.
- Sometime around November 2015, he started discussing the staged accident on 01/27/16. He specifically told McGruder the following:
 - All she had to do was call her insurance company.
 - She had an accident and hit him.

- Tell them you didn't call the police, and you gave the person you hit your information.
- McGruder was surprised and could tell he had prior experience because he laid out the whole plan. The male replied, "yeah, it's easy."
- When McGruder spoke with GEICO, the male was sitting next to her in the car. She knew what to say because he had previously coached her. He also told her that GEICO contacted him. Sometime later, the male and McGruder stopped communicating.
- McGruder admitted she was not truthful with us before, and apologized. McGruder explained she knew she was in trouble and was scared when we previously spoke with her.
- McGruder reiterated the 01/27/16 accident never happened and the male started discussing it about two months prior.
- McGruder said the male moved out here from L.A. and stayed with a male friend (NU). We asked if his friend was Allen Davis, but McGruder didn't know who that was.
- According to McGruder, the male drove a cream/gold or tan BMW SUV possibly with red wheels. Their relationship lasted approximately two months, and they were intimate.
- The male never threatened McGruder, but got mad at her and cussed her out. McGruder eventually blocked his phone number, and didn't have his number anymore.
- McGruder stated she would apologize to GEICO for putting herself and the company "into that bullshit." She did not receive any money from the claim, and didn't know how much money the male received.
- McGruder said she told us the truth 100%, and was willing to testify in court.
- We told McGruder the prosecutor would determine if she would be charged, and McGruder understood what she did was wrong.

he did it for the money, and told her his last two payouts were "pretty good." He told

After Investigator Ross interviewed Drain on 03/26/16 at the Hooters Casino, he immediately canvassed the scene at her residence and took a picture of what appeared to be the same Dodge bearing CA plate "7REM829" parked behind Drain's BMW. LEE appeared to be sleeping inside and wore the same sunglasses from his Facebook post. Investigator Ross knocked on the Dodge window, but did not receive an answer. Drain admitted the accident was fictitious.

- On January 9, 2018, I briefly spoke with Ralph Crowder via phone and he denied knowing Cibeleana Drain and LEE. He said he was busy and would call me back. However, I have not heard back from Crowder.
- Drain told SIU Investigator Ross that Crowder was a friend from California, she had known him about 1-2 years, Crowder let her use his vehicle, and he picked it up and drove it back to California.
- On April 18, 2018, Investigator K. Huss and I interviewed Drain at her residence.
 She was not in custody, and agreed to have the interview recorded. In summary:
- Drain claimed she was driving the BMW SUV and a male bumped up against the BMW. She couldn't recall his name, and never called or met the male before the accident occurred.
- Drain confirmed the accident was not planned or staged in any way. She had never

- planned or staged an accident before.
- The purported accident occurred late at night, and Drain was returning to her residence 1427 Silver Mesa Circle #4 Las Vegas, NV 89169.
- Drain reiterated "I don't know the guy," and remembered meeting with an insurance investigator, and how he recorded their conversation.
- After the accident occurred, the male pedestrian refused medical assistance and "kinda limped away." (Note: Drain was shown black and white photos from the Liberty Mutual claim records of Navar LEE). She thought he sort of looked similar, but it was a dark intersection when she saw him.
- According to Drain, she was paying for the insurance on the BMW to Liberty Mutual.
- We told Drain we believed that she already knew LEE, but she denied it again. Eventually, Drain confessed to knowing LEE.
- Drain explained she met **LEE** online through the website Plenty of Fish.com (note: www.pof.com). Drain indicated she was trying to be truthful, and acknowledged the situation was a mess.
- LEE mentioned to Drain that he was going through some financial trouble. LEE told Drain he had a car, to call the insurance company, say you hit me, and "we'll get the money." At the time, Drain didn't think it was a good thing to do. LEE said he had done it a couple of times "and it did work."
- LEE told Drain to call the insurance company and file the claim. He told Drain "what to say and how to do it," because she didn't know. She recalled on the insurance recording she was very nervous, and didn't know what to say. During the process, LEE was not "nice" to Drain.
- After the insurance investigator (note: Justin Ross) spoke with Drain she told LEE she didn't want to have anything else to do with it.
- Drain was shocked to hear that **LEE** had previously filed so many insurance claims.
- Initially, LEE said Drain would receive half of the insurance payout. LEE did not provide a dollar amount, but claimed the other two times he did it he received

different amounts. Drain believed her cut changed to LEE taking the larger portion and she would receive "a couple of dollars."

- Drain was asked to explain why LEE was waiting outside in his car at her former residence at Silver Mesa Circle. This occurred on 03/26/16 after Liberty Mutual Investigator Ross had finished interviewing Drain at the Hooters Casino. She stated **LEE** wasn't waiting for her, and that she was already evicted from that residence. Drain believed LEE rented his Dodge Challenger and may have been living in it outside her residence. At the time, Drain was staying at Motel 6, and that's why she met Investigator Ross at Hooter's.
- According to Drain, the BMW was owned by LEE's friend Ralph Crowder. She opined Crowder was not involved. The BMW had some issues and wasn't really working. Drain was not friends with Crowder, she never spoke with him on the phone, and did not personally meet him. She didn't know if Crowder and LEE were close friends.
- LEE told Drain the BMW was towed to her house. She didn't know what happened to the BMW before it was towed to her former residence (note: 1427 Silver Mesa Drain opined LEE rented the Dodge Challenger probably because he needed something to live in and drive around. LEE was not staying at Drain's residence, and would not listen to her to leave the area. She didn't know if LEE stayed there to guard the BMW.
- Drain never received any money from LEE.
- LEE and Drain met in Las Vegas, and she didn't think he was a stalker. Drain thought LEE stayed outside her residence to see if the claim went through. LEE didn't appear to be interested in Drain, and seemed more interested in the claim. Drain asked LEE why he was staying in front of her residence, he replied he had a right to be there and it was a public street.
- Drain and LEE's relationship lasted around one month. At the time, Drain was trying to find work and had fallen on hard times. She tried to help **LEE** out, and they

were not intimate with each other "not really, no."

- Approximately two weeks before the 03/09/16 claim, LEE talked to Drain about doing the insurance claim.
- Drain specified some of the things LEE told her to tell the insurance company:
 - Tell them you got into an accident.
 - This is the car.
 - Tell them this is Ralph's car, but you were driving it.
 - That you hit me on the corner and LEE didn't want any medical assistance.
- Toward the end of their relationship, LEE told Drain an investigator was coming to talk to him, and LEE might want to talk to her about the situation. At the time, LEE was "being very nasty with me" but he did not threaten Drain.
- Drain didn't have old text messages with LEE.
- LEE told Drain he had previously received approximately \$7,000-\$10,000 from other insurance claims.
- After Drain spoke with the insurance investigator she realized the situation was a mess and thought "what did I get myself into?" At the time, she knew insurance fraud was a crime, but was not "thinking straight at all," and expressed remorse.
- Drain confirmed the 03/09/16 pedestrian accident never occurred. It was all made up, and was a fabrication.
- Drain needed time to think about testifying in court to clear her name. She would consider it.
- Drain stated she was not afraid of LEE, and felt like a "mule" in the situation.
- Drain didn't think Ralph Crowder lived in Las Vegas, and never saw him or met him.
- According to Drain, LEE didn't get along with his mother, and might be living in Las Vegas and Los Angeles, California.
- LEE told Drain he had received money from previous claims and lived off it.
- Drain was asked what she would tell the CEO of Liberty Mutual. Drain replied that she would apologize, and realized how serious the situation is now. She regretted

her story with Liberty Mutual Investigator Ross.

- LEE and Drain were not boyfriend and girlfriend at the time of the claim.
- Drain admitted to making the phone call to the insurance company, but did not submit any documents to them.
- Drain didn't know LEE's whereabouts, and does not talk to him anymore.

Red Flags: Struck in crosswalk. Ridley's two recorded statements sounded like Navar LEE. Ridley's phone number (702-500-3376, RS & claim notes) was used in the 07/04/16 GEICO claim with Allen Davis (GEICO notes: 07/08/16, 09/09/16 & 09/20/16). Ridley's address: 1413 Silver Mesa #1 LV, NV 89169 is similar to Allen Davis' address he provided in my 01/18/18 interview (1413 Silver Mesa Cir, apt number not provided). Ridley claimed he was missing a diamond earring (from his deceased grandmother) is similar to Lee's 05/20/15 claim. Ridley initially wanted \$7k or he'd go to the ER and run up additional bills. Then he wanted \$8k (notes: 08/11/16).

- On May 8, 2018, Investigator K. Huss and I interviewed Johnnie Ridley at High Desert State Prison in Indian Springs, Nevada regarding the claim. Ridley was in custody, and was read his Miranda rights. He agreed to speak with us, and have the interview recorded. In summary:
- Ridley was shown a black and white photo of a Nevada Identification card (note: Navar LEE) and was asked if he recognized him. Ridley said he'd "never seen him before."
- Ridley was asked if he heard of Navar LEE. He acknowledged that he did not, he didn't remember him, and LEE did not look familiar.
- Ridley was asked about the last time he visited a hospital. He replied that he visited the UMC hospital in Las Vegas in 2014.
- Ridley acknowledged he did not visit Sunrise Hospital on Maryland Parkway and Desert Inn (DI). He was asked if he visited Sunrise Hospital on July 20, 2016. "Not from my recollection...not that I remember."

- According to Ridley, he lost his ID and wallet a couple of years ago. He lost his ID, Social Security card, and birth certificate. Ridley didn't know where he lost them.
- In July 2016, Ridley resided at 1216 Helen St. N. Las Vegas, NV 89030 with his mother Marzette Lewis.
- Ridley acknowledged he did not fax any documents to an insurance company in the last two years. He was shown three pages of a fax submitted 08/09/16 from the "Copy Shoppe" regarding a 07/20/16 Sunrise Hospital visit. Ridley indicated he did not fax it, and didn't recognize the paperwork.
- We discussed the Sunrise Hospital sheet (note: obtained from Sunrise Hospital records).
 - Sara Qutob was Ridley's girlfriend and the mother of his daughter.
 - Ridley was "pretty sure" he was unemployed in July 2016. His girlfriend was working at Crescent Jeweler's in Pahrump.
 - Ridley confirmed his DOB was 07/04/85, and the last four digits of his SSN xxx-xx-6089.
 - Ridley didn't know who provided this information.
- We told Ridley an American Family Insurance claim was filed under his name and we were trying to verify the information. Ridley said "I don't remember none of that sir."
- Ridley's last insurance claim was around 12/12/2017. He acknowledged he never hit anyone with his vehicle in his lifetime. The December 2017 accident involved another vehicle and Ridley received about \$5,000. At that time, Ridley's insurance company was Estrella.
- Ridley didn't know why someone would provide his information for a hospital visit, and reiterated he did not know Navar LEE.
- Ridley acknowledged he never staged a car accident or pedestrian accident in his life. He was asked if anyone asked him to file a false insurance claim for money "not that I remember sir, no."

- Ridley understood insurance fraud was a felony, and it's wrong.
- We told Ridley that Navar LEE knew him, but Ridley reiterated he did not know **LEE**. Ridley alleged, maybe **LEE** was the one who found his ID.
- Ridley was told again that we didn't believe him, and that he already knew LEE. He was asked to tell us what happened, and how much money LEE offered him. At this point, Ridley said he needed to speak with his lawyer (note: identified after the interview as Roger Bailey).
- On May 8, 2018, Investigator L. Rosel and I interviewed Nakeshai Nicholson at the Attorney General's Office. Nicholson came in voluntarily, was not in custody, and agreed to have the interview recorded. In summary:
- Nicholson recalled the 07/19/16 claim with American Family Insurance and said "it scared me." Nicholson explained she was driving after leaving the Cannery "one night" and "I was turning and I didn't see the guy that was crossing the street." Nicholson got out of her vehicle and asked if he was ok after she "accidentally had hit him." The male told her he was fine, and was "kinda" limping. She couldn't remember his name.
- The accident occurred "at nighttime" and it was dark. Nicholson couldn't remember what she was doing at the Cannery, and was driving her 2004 Camry.
- The person was in the crosswalk, but Nicholson didn't see them because "they had on really dark clothing." She couldn't remember the cross streets where the accident occurred or specific details.
- Nicholson stated she gave the details to the insurance representative and called them the "next day."
- Nicholson gave the pedestrian her insurance information, and described him as a Caucasian male and possibly in his 30's. Nicholson was asked if he was tall, short, or middle and replied "middle." She didn't pay much attention to his build because she was concerned if he was ok.

- Nicholson did not call the police, and the male "was like, I'm good." She provided him her information and insurance.
- Nicholson did not know the male before the accident occurred, "never."
- Nicholson was asked if the accident was planned or staged in any way. She replied, "how would you plan something like that? No."
- Nicholson was aware of the website Plenty of Fish (note: www.pof.com). acknowledged being on it before, and was "probably" on it in 2016. Nicholson said she blogged based on her dating experiences. Nicholson said "it's a possibility" that she was on the website in July 2016.
- We showed a Nevada Identification Card of a male (note: Navar LEE) to Nicholson. She stated "I don't recognize that person at all."
- Nicholson was asked about the name Navar LEE. She said he "doesn't sound familiar, no."
- Investigator Rosel asked Nicholson if she met the male (note: pointing to Navar LEE's Nevada ID card photo) on Plenty of Fish. She replied [sic] "he doesn't look familiar if for anybody I've met there before, no."
- Nicholson stated she had "absolutely been 100% truthful."
- Nicholson understood insurance fraud or false claims are felonies in Nevada, "absolutely."
- Nicholson was told the situation was a gigantic mess, and she was in a lot of At that point, Nicholson elected to leave our interview. Nicholson trouble. mentioned she already consulted with her attorney, and he told her "yeah, go see what they have to say." She felt "uncomfortable" with the situation and decided to leave.
- 24. Based on the above information, and totality of the circumstances, it is believed LEE misrepresented material facts related to his bodily injuries and insurance claims to fraudulently collect approximately \$50,666 in insurance benefits from GEICO, USAA, State Farm, and American Family Insurance. LEE also attempted to collect money from GEICO

- 25. All of the previously alleged acts have been committed or completed by **LEE**, in or about May 2015 August 2016 within the County of Clark, State of Nevada.
