About Protection Orders

The reporting of the protection order data presented here is collected per the guidelines set forth in Nevada Revised Statute 179A.350.

NRS 179A.350 Creation; contents; prompt entry of information; accessibility; retention of records; submission of report to Legislature.

1. The Repository for Information Concerning Orders for Protection is hereby created within the Central Repository.

2. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 10, the Repository for Information Concerning Orders for Protection must contain a complete and systematic record of all:

(a) Temporary and extended orders for protection against domestic violence issued or registered in the State of Nevada and all Canadian domestic-violence protection orders registered in the State of Nevada, including, without limitation, any information received pursuant to <u>NRS 33.095</u>;

(b) Temporary and extended orders for protection against stalking, aggravated stalking or harassment issued in this State pursuant to <u>NRS 200.599</u>; and

(c) Temporary and extended orders for protection against a person alleged to have committed the crime of sexual assault issued in this State pursuant to <u>NRS 200.37835</u>.

(d) Orders imposing, modifying, suspending or canceling a condition of release prohibiting contact issued in this State pursuant to <u>NRS 178.4845</u>

3. The records contained in the Repository for Information Concerning Orders for Protection must be kept in accordance with the regulations adopted by the Director of the Department.

4. Information received by the Central Repository pursuant to <u>NRS 33.095</u>, <u>178.4845</u>, <u>200.37835</u> and <u>200.599</u> must be entered in the Repository for Information Concerning Orders for Protection.

5. The information in the Repository for Information Concerning Orders for Protection must be accessible by computer at all times to each agency of criminal justice.

6. The Repository for Information Concerning Orders for Protection shall retain all records of an expired temporary or extended order for protection and all records of an expired, suspended or cancelled order imposing a condition of release prohibiting contact, unless any such order is sealed by a court of competent jurisdiction.





About Protection Orders contd.

7. The existence of a record of an expired temporary or extended order for protection or a record of an expired, suspended or cancelled order imposing a condition of release prohibiting contact in the Repository for Information Concerning Orders for Protection does not prohibit a person from obtaining a firearm or a permit to carry a concealed firearm unless such conduct violates:

- (a) A court order; or
- (b) Any provision of federal or state law.

8. The Director of the Department shall provide an electronic means to access on the Central Repository's Internet website statistical data concerning all temporary and extended orders for protection issued pursuant to <u>NRS 33.020, 200.378</u> and <u>200.591</u> during the previous calendar year that were transmitted to the Repository for Information Concerning Orders for Protection. The data must include, without limitation, information for each court that issues temporary or extended orders for protection pursuant to <u>NRS 33.020, 200.378</u> and <u>200.591</u>, respectively, concerning:

(a) The total number of temporary and extended orders that were granted by the court during the calendar year to which the data pertains;

- (b) The number of temporary and extended orders that were granted to women;
- (c) The number of temporary and extended orders that were granted to men;
- (d) The number of temporary and extended orders that were vacated or expired;
- (e) The number of temporary orders that included a grant of temporary custody of a minor child; and
- (f) The number of temporary and extended orders that were served on the adverse party.

9. The information provided pursuant to subsection 8 must include only aggregate information for statistical purposes and must exclude any identifying information relating to a particular person.

10. The Repository for Information Concerning Orders for Protection must not contain any information concerning an event that occurred before October 1, 1998.

11. As used in this section, "Canadian domestic-violence protection order" has the meaning ascribed to it in <u>NRS 33.119</u>.

Protection Orders – DV and SH

Definitions

The following report will describe and summarize temporary and extended protection orders issued in the State of Nevada. These reports are broken down to show which orders were granted to men and to women. Also included is a listing of those orders that included custody of a minor child and available historic data.

- **Temporary Protection Order:** Can be granted within 24 hours of receiving the application and in effect up to 45 days or until scheduled court hearing.
- Extended Protection Order: Awarded only after a hearing before a judge and in effect for up to two years.
- **Expired Order:** A Temporary Protection Order or Extended Protection Order that has reached the expiration date and was not extended further.
- **Vacated Order**: A Temporary Protection Order or Extended Protection Order that was cancelled or dissolved prior to the expiration date.

Any of the above Domestic Violence or Stalking and Harassment Protection orders could include a grant of temporary custody of a minor child.

Note that on the graphs you will see gender described as male, female, and unknown. Unknown includes those who entered unknown on the application or those that did not complete the gender portion of the application.

About Aging & Disability Services

The following statistics are provided to the Department of Public Safety from the Nevada Aging and Disabilities Services Division (ADSD), Adult Protective Services (APS). Effective July 1, 2019, Aging and Disability Services Division received legislative authority to receive and investigate reports of abuse, neglect, exploitation, isolation or abandonment for vulnerable persons, age 18-59, in addition to persons 60 years and older, collectively referred to as vulnerable adults. Adult Protective Services serves all of Nevada.

Substantiated and unsubstantiated incidents reported are considered. These figures are published exactly as Aging and Disabilities Services Division presents them to the Department of Public Safety.

Note: Totals in the various categories may not match because of the variations of number of alleged offenders for each victim and the possibility that one victim could have sustained multiple types of maltreatment.

The Crimes Against Older Persons data presented here is collected per the requirements set forth in Nevada Revised Statute 179A.450.

NRS 179A.450

NRS 179A.450 Creation; contents; electronic means to access data; confidentiality of data.

1. The Repository for Information Concerning Crimes Against Older Persons or Vulnerable Persons is hereby created within the Central Repository.

2. The Repository for Information Concerning Crimes Against Older Persons or Vulnerable Persons must contain a complete and systematic record of all reports of the abuse, neglect, exploitation, isolation or abandonment of older persons or vulnerable persons in this State. The record must be prepared in a manner approved by the Director of the Department and must include, without limitation, the following information:

(a) All incidents that are reported to state and local law enforcement agencies and the Aging and Disability Services Division of the Department of Health and Human Services.

(b) All cases that were investigated and the type of such cases.

3. The Director of the Department shall provide an electronic means to access on the Central Repository's Internet website statistical data on the abuse, neglect, exploitation, isolation or abandonment of older persons or vulnerable persons.

4. The data and findings generated pursuant to this section must not contain information that may reveal the identity of an individual victim, or a person accus

ed of the abuse, neglect, exploitation, isolation or abandonment of older persons or vulnerable persons.

- 5. As used in this section:
- (a) "Abandonment" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 200.5092.
- (b) "Abuse" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 200.5092.
- (c) "Exploitation" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 200.5092.
- (d) "Isolation" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 200.5092.
- (e) "Neglect" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 200.5092.
- (f) "Older person" means a person who is 60 years of age or older.
- (g) "Vulnerable person" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 200.5092.

The reporting of the additional data presented here is collected per the guidelines set forth in NRS 193.360 & NRS 179A.175

NRS 193.360

Duty of state and local law enforcement agencies to submit data relating to crimes manifesting evidence of prejudice based on race, color, religion, national origin, physical or mental disability, sexual orientation or gender identity or expression, limitation on use of data.

- Each state or local law enforcement agency in this State shall submit on a monthly basis a record of all crimes that manifest evidence of prejudice based on race, color, religion, national origin, physical or mental disability, sexual orientation or gender identity or expression, including, without limitation, the basis on which any such crime occurred, to the Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal History, in accordance with the guidelines adopted by the Director of the Department of Public Safety pursuant to subsection 2 of <u>NRS 179A.175</u>.
- Data acquired pursuant to this section must be used only for research or statistical purposes and must not contain any information that may reveal the identity of an individual victim of a crime. (Added to NRS by <u>2021, 236)</u>

NRS 179A.175

Establishing program; adoption of guidelines for collection of statistical data; report; data to be used only for research or statistical purposes; data to be made available to public; data to be provided to Federal Bureau of Investigation.

- 1. The Director of the Department shall establish within the Central Repository a program for reporting crimes that manifest evidence of prejudice based on race, color, religion, national origin, physical or mental disability, sexual orientation or gender identity or expression.
- 2. The program must be designed to collect, compile and analyze statistical data about crimes that manifest evidence of prejudice based on race, color, religion, national origin, physical or mental disability, sexual orientation or gender identity or expression. The Director shall adopt guidelines for the collection of the statistical data, including, but not limited to, the criteria to establish the presence of prejudice and the manner in which the data must be reported to the Central Repository.





About Supplemental Hate Crime Data (contd)

- 3. The Central Repository shall include in any appropriate report an independent section relating solely to the analysis of crimes that manifest evidence of prejudice based on race, color, religion, national origin, physical or mental disability, sexual orientation or gender identity or expression.
- 4. Data acquired pursuant to this section must be used only for research or statistical purposes and must not contain any information that may reveal the identity of an individual victim of a crime.
- The Central Repository shall make all data acquired pursuant to this section and data regarding any prosecution of a violation of <u>NRS 207.185</u> and any sentence imposed pursuant to <u>NRS</u> <u>193.1675</u> available to the public.
- 6. The Central Repository shall ensure that the data acquired pursuant to this section is provided to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for inclusion in the annual Hate Crime Statistics report of the Uniform Crime Reporting Program.
- 7. As used in this section, "gender identity or expression" has the meaning ascribed to it in <u>NRS</u> <u>193.0148.</u>

Report Terminologies

The following report will describe and summarize the supplemental Hate Crime reports that are received by the Criminal Records Unit within the Department of Public Safety in the State of Nevada.

The information contained in this report was gathered by running reports in house. The following definitions describe the various variables used in the reports.

- **Hate Crime Arrests:** The total number of arrests with one of the hate crime Nevada Offense Codes (NOCs) during the time-period selected.
- Hate Crime Arrests with Dispositions: The total number of arrests with hate crime NOCS and the number that have dispositions, but it does not differentiate between the type of disposition or disposition NOC
- Hate Crime Arrests with Hate Crime Dispositions: Total number of convictions where the original
 arrest was a hate crime NOC and the disposition is Pled Guilty (PLG), Found Guilty (GAT) or Deferred
 adjudication (DEF) and the disposition NOC was a hate crime NOC (if the disposition was dismissed,
 charges were denied by the prosecutor, no charges filed or not guilty, then it wasn't a conviction
 therefore is not included.)
